

Driver's Privacy Protection Act is the federal law that regulates the release of motor vehicle records and how recipients of such records share them. DPPA limits the release of personal information such as social security number, driver identification number, name, address, telephone number, medical or disability information except for limited permissible uses. With some exceptions, The Drivers' Privacy Protection Act prohibits public access to information in state motor vehicle registration records and driver's license records. It also requires the state agency to tell the person whose information is being requested about the request and get their permission to turn the information over.
